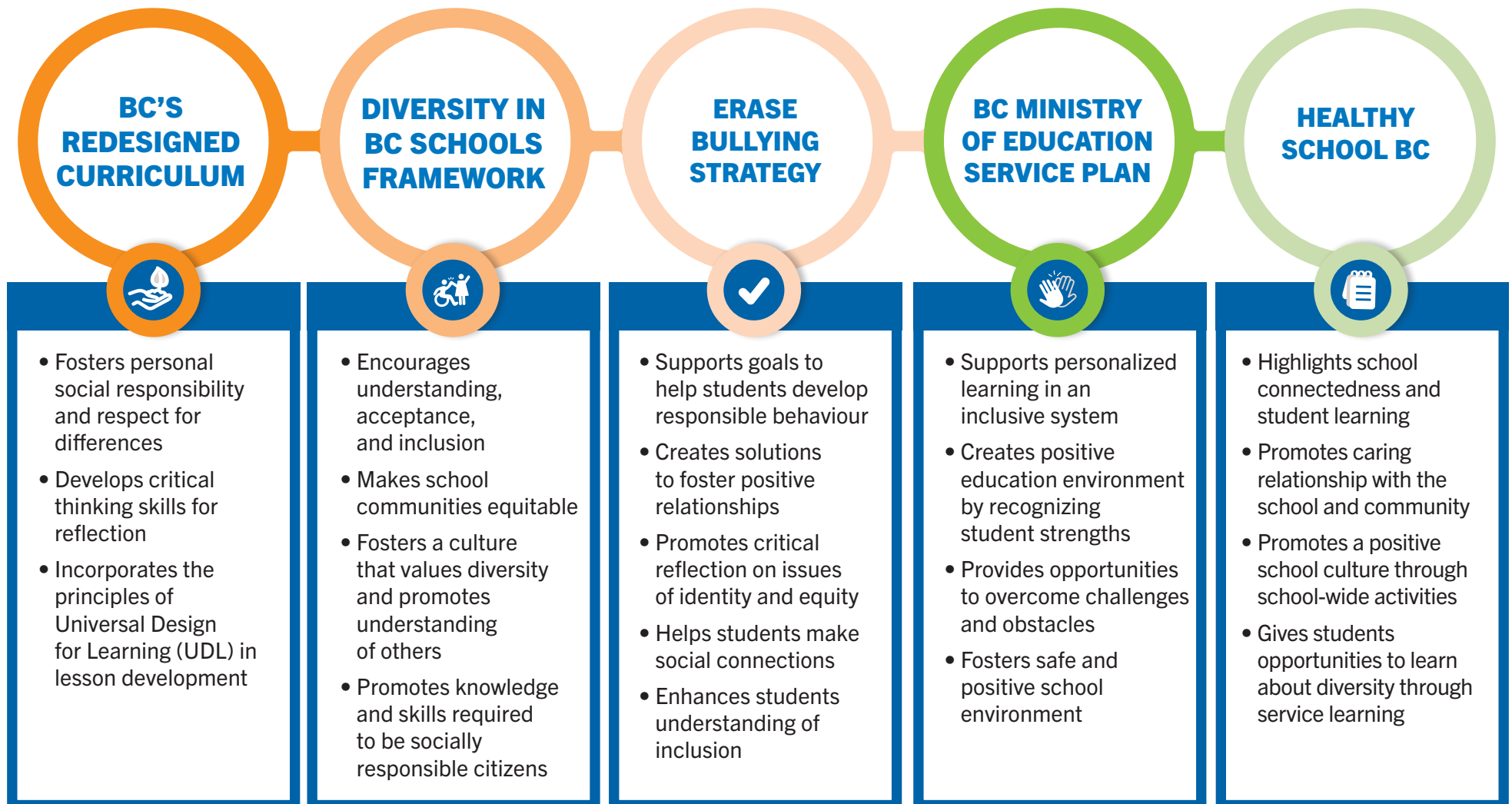

EDUCATION POLICIES: BRITISH COLUMBIA

The Rick Hansen Foundation School Program supports key British Columbia education priorities

The Rick Hansen Foundation School Program (RHFSP) provides free, ready-made materials to support the implementation of **BC's redesigned curriculum**. The redesign of curriculum and assessment focuses on the competencies that are vital to personal and social success, life-long learning, and to the changing workplace. RHFSP supports each of these competencies:

- **Personal and Social:** RHFSP helps students explore their own identity, develop an understanding of their communities, and identify and pursue personal passions that contribute to society. The program fosters social responsibility and respect for differences, and through practical projects inspires and empowers students to make a positive contribution to their communities.
- **Thinking:** RHFSP is built around activities and projects that develop specific thinking skills, such as problem solving, planning, and goal setting. Critical and reflective thinking are encouraged.
- **Communication:** communication is a key part of the program, as students develop written and oral communication skills, literacy and presentation skills.

Diversity in BC Schools: a Framework. In striving to create and maintain conditions that foster success for all students, the Ministry of Education identifies key conditions including school cultures that value diversity and promote understanding of others. RHFSP can be a key tool in fostering such cultures. Key goals of the Ministry's policy include encouraging understanding, acceptance, mutual respect, and inclusion, in order to make school communities more equitable. A key attribute of a BC graduate is stated to be having the knowledge and skills required to be a socially responsible citizen who acts in caring and principled ways, respecting the diversity of all people; these are also characteristics that RHFSP teaches to students.

Safe, Caring and Orderly Schools Strategy. This strategy recognizes that the school system must strive to ensure that differences among learners do not impede their participation in school, or their ability to become contributing members of society. One school principal who has implemented RHFSP recently remarked, *"Since we started the focus on difference making this year, I see way more generosity, understanding and acceptance on the part of staff, more understanding of special needs students in particular, more acceptance of uniqueness and difference and that it can lead to great achievement and more willingness to take what kids come with and work with it."*

The **ERASE Bullying Strategy** promotes positive mental health and wellness while preventing bullying and violent behaviours. RHFSP can support the implementation of the strategy by fostering safe and inclusive school cultures that reduce the risk of bullying.

A key strategy of the **BC Ministry of Education 2017 Service Plan** is personalized learning by creating an inclusive education system that recognizes and supports the needs of Aboriginal, French-language, English Language Learning, international, and rural students, as well as students with special needs. A further key strategy is to create a positive educational environment that allows students to discover their strengths and provides students with opportunities to overcome challenges and learn to succeed. RHFSP teaches inclusion and overcoming obstacles, and fosters safe and positive school environments where all students can achieve their full potential.

The **Healthy Schools BC** framework highlights that school connectedness supports student learning. It uses the *Comprehensive School Health Framework* to promote caring relationships with the school and broader community. Suggestions in the framework include holding school-wide activities or providing opportunities for service learning that give students opportunities to learn about diversity and increase understanding of similarities and differences. Lessons and activities in the RHFSP Difference Maker and Abilities in Motion toolkits provide students with these opportunities while also aligning with various BC curriculum expectations.

RHFSP is easily incorporated into BC curriculum.

English Language Arts K – 12

RHFSP supports the **English Language Arts** curriculum by providing opportunities to help students understand and appreciate language, and to use it confidently and competently in a variety of situations for learning, communication, work, life, and personal satisfaction. From responding to a story in Kindergarten to developing presentations at the secondary level, RHFSP supports the development of students' abilities with speaking and listening, reading and viewing, and writing and representing. Materials include tools for self-assessment and reflection.

Social Studies K – 11

Key goals for the curriculum are to encourage and enable students to demonstrate respect for human equality and diversity, and develop the skills and attitudes necessary to become thoughtful, active citizens in society who understand their rights and responsibilities as Canadians and reflect critically on multiple perspectives of national and international issues. RHFSP aligns with these goals by teaching understanding of diversity and inclusion, and focusing on community involvement and difference making. RHFSP achieves these aims by underscoring students' agency in creating and maintaining equitable and inclusive environments as well as youth's ability to positively impact their local communities and even the global community.

Civics 11

The aim of this curriculum is for students to gain civic knowledge and apply decision making and critical thinking skills, in order to become more active participants in civic life. RHFSP's secondary curriculum supports these goals, especially growing students' willingness to pursue civic action by encouraging students to create and implement a Difference Maker campaign that positively impacts their school or local community.

Science K-7

The aim of this curriculum is to develop scientifically literate students who inquire, problem solve, and make decisions while maintaining a sense of wonder about the world. RHFSP supports these aims and the specific curriculum expectations for Materials and Structures, and Forces and Simple Machines. The lessons emphasize critical thinking and problem solving using hands on activities.

Career Education K –12

The aim of the newly redesigned **Career Education** curriculum incorporates elements of career education in various stages for awareness, exploration and experience. RHFSP supports learning in stages one and two as students explore personal skills, personal interests, and their roles and responsibilities in their school and community. The lessons support objectives such as appreciating diversity, the uniqueness of self and others, and how students can support an inclusive school climate. The focus in stages 3 and 4 related to leadership is supported by secondary lessons that teach effective communication, teamwork and problem-solving skills. The elementary Difference Maker lessons provide students with an opportunity for meaningful project opportunities for making positive contributions to schools and communities. RHFSP supports stage 5 expectations by encouraging students to seek out paths that align with their personal strengths and values and providing leadership opportunities through the secondary RHFSP Personal Leadership unit.

Health

Key goals in the redesigned **Health** curriculum include developing healthy relationships, advocating for the well-being of others, and making connections to our community. RHFSP provides students with opportunities to develop positive attitudes and confidence by examining personal strengths and values, highlighting the importance of healthy relationships and working well with others, and appreciating each student's capacity to make a positive contribution to the school and community.

Business Education 8-12

The aim of this curriculum is to develop students' potential while acquiring the knowledge, skills, and attitudes required to contribute to a healthy society and a prosperous and sustainable economy. RHFSP's secondary curriculum supports these goals by highlighting how businesses that have intentionally planned to be inclusive and accessible have a commercial advantage.
