

EDUCATION POLICIES: NEW BRUNSWICK

The Rick Hansen Foundation School Program supports key New Brunswick education priorities.

Everyone at their best outlines the vision for public education and improvements over the next ten years. It emphasizes diversity and respect. It recommends establishing a culture of belonging and valuing diversity. The Rick Hansen Foundation School Program (RHFSP) supports this ten year plan through lessons on inclusion and accessibility. RHFSP supports New Brunswick Inclusive Education Policy 322 and is a pairing of philosophy and pedagogical practices that allow each student to feel respected, confident, and safe so students can learn and develop to their full potential. RHFSP supports this philosophy by providing lessons and activities to increase awareness and understanding of differences, promote social cohesion, belonging, active participation, and positive interactions with peers and others in the school community.

The Atlantic Canada Framework for Essential Graduation Learning adopted by New Brunswick identifies several key areas to help students develop knowledge, skills, abilities, and attitudes to become responsible and caring people. RHFSP supports the framework by helping students to develop respect, empathy, and compassion. It uses project-based, hands-on learning to help students develop innovative solutions to community needs and appreciate difference makers in their communities and across Canada. In doing so, students seek support for themselves and advocate for others to achieve a fair and just society. RHFSP fosters social responsibility and respect for differences through personal leadership and responsible citizenship lessons that have been developed specifically for secondary school audiences.

When Kids Come First is designed to ensure New Brunswick's education system fosters innovative, critical thinkers who have been provided with the opportunity to find something that has ignited their passion for learning. It outlines a collective responsibility to ensure that all children are helped in every way possible to reach their full potential. RHFSP fosters social responsibility and respect for difference. Through practical projects, it inspires and empowers students to identify their passions and learn the skills that will enable them to make a positive contribution to their communities.

Policy 703: Positive Learning and Working Environment and Safe and Healthy **Schools** policies provide a framework to foster positive learning environments that are inclusive, safe, respect human rights, and support diversity. The aims of these policies align with RHFSP, which promotes and enhances students' capacity for positive school relationships, building community, and increasing personal accountability. By teaching inclusion, awareness, and social responsibility, RHFSP is an ideal tool to support a safe and caring school environment.

Keeping Our Schools Safe recommends mobilizing student leadership to address and improve school cultures. RHFSP supports this aim by developing students' leadership skills and encouraging them to see themselves as agents for change who can contribute to a culture of inclusion in their schools and in broader society. RHFSP also provides opportunities for celebration of individual and community achievement.

RHFSP is easily incorporated into New Brunswick curriculum.

English Language Arts (K-12). This curriculum provides students with opportunities to speak and listen to explore, clarify, extend, and reflect on their thoughts, ideas, feelings, and experiences. Students communicate information and ideas effectively and clearly, to respond personally and critically to materials. They practice skills to interact with sensitivity and respect, considering the situation, audience, and purpose. A key feature of RHFSP is an emphasis on active participation, which encourages students to reflect and engage. RHFSP supports essential graduation learning through fostering citizenship, communication, problem solving, personal development, and personal and social connections.

The Foundations for The **Atlantic Canada Social Studies Curriculum** embody principles of freedom, equality, justice, human dignity, civic rights, and responsibility. RHFSP promotes student growth, allowing students the opportunity to apply knowledge, skills, and attitudes to become informed, responsible citizens, and participate to improve society and communities. RHFSP aligns with the goals of the Social Studies curriculum through skills training and engaging students in social-action projects within their school or community. Lessons on access, equity, and inclusion are available for all levels, encouraging students to engage in thinking about diversity, respect, and equality.

The aim of the elementary **Science** curriculum is to develop scientifically literate students who inquire, problem solve, and make decisions while maintaining a sense of wonder about the world. RHFSP supports these aims and the specific curriculum expectations for Structures (Grade 3) and Weather, Simple Machines, and Body Systems (Grade 5).

Physical and Health Education (K-12). Curriculum outcomes include acceptance and appreciation for the abilities of others, positive collaborative skills, nurturing behaviour, and respect for individual physical and cultural differences. RHFSP activities provide students with an opportunity to recognize and respect differences, develop teamwork and communication skills, and develop empathy, in order to enhance their relationships with others.
